An independent incorporated film society that aims to provide members with a stimulating program of films from old and new Greek Cinema in a variety of genres, as well as films that relate to Greek diasporic life and its contact with other cinemas.

Screenings take place fortnightly in six-monthly programs at the Greek Atlas Community and Cultural Centre, 96 Illawarra Rd (old Marrickville Town Hall).

All films have English subtitles and projection is in DVD format. Screenings are followed by discussion and films are introduced by members or special guest speakers. The Society's activities are conducted in both English or Greek.

For those who want to catch a meal before the screening, the Centre's restaurant is open for tasty and affordable meals.
